
Thanksgiving Ecumenical Service

True Thanksgiving:

The 'Grace - Gratitude' Rhythm of the Christian Life



Considering all the books that have been written about the indescribable grace of God, the above graphic may be "worth a thousand words"! It summarizes how God's grace is given – and responded to – as the essential aspect of the life of a follower of Jesus.

In the top center is the Geek letter Theta – the first letter in Theos – the Greek word for God. And – directly below, in the center – we find Us, created in the image of God.

Moving clockwise from God, are several colorful arrows – representing the spectrum of colors which characterize the innumerable aspects of God's grace toward us. In short, we are blessed by the gift of life itself, this fair earth – created to be our home, the energy of the sun, and the water which sustains life. And, we have the free gift of salvation – God's Riches At Christ's Expense.

For all of this, we are truly grateful! But, we cannot – as mortals – do anything to increase the majesty and sovereignty of God, the very ground of our being.

But – moving clockwise upward from Us – we can be a blessing to God's other children. And – when we do so – we show our gratitude for God's grace to us by blessing them. Think of a neighbor who – seeing our child out in the street – rushes out to whisk our child out of harm's way. They have, indeed, blessed us in so doing.

So – as we prepare for this coming season of Thanksgiving – may we express our gratitude to God by being a blessing to others!

Praise the Lord! (Psalm 117)

Psalm 117:1; "Praise the Lord, all you nations! Extol Him, all you peoples!" (NRSV)

This psalm forms the shortest chapter in the bible. It is a hymn, composed of a call to praise, a statement of the grounds of that praise, and a conclusion. The call to praise is a missionary invitation addressed to all the nations. It is quoted by Paul in Romans 15:11 in support of God's missionary purpose among the gentiles; "Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles, and let all the peoples praise him".

Since this is one of the six Egyptian Hallel Psalms (113-118), sung as part of the Passover service, Jesus would have sung Psalm 117 with His disciples (Matthew 26:30 Mark 14:26). Therefore, on the eve of His crucifixion, we know that Jesus had all the peoples, all the Gentiles in mind. Through His work on the cross and victory over death at the empty tomb, God would call a people to Himself from every tribe and tongue.

Martin Luther, the Reformer, devoted thirty-six pages to this psalm. He indicated, however, that before we could better fully understand this psalm, we should also read Paul's questions in Romans 10:14. "But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him?"

Luther declared "As I see it, the whole book of Acts was written because of this psalm." He expounded this psalm in four important categories: (1) prophecy (the Gentiles will participate in gospel blessings), (2) revelation (the kingdom of Christ is not earthly and temporal but rather heavenly and eternal), (3) instruction (we are saved by faith alone and not by works, wisdom, or holiness), and (4) admonition (we should praise God for such a great salvation).

When Christians say and sing this psalm, they remind themselves that the praise of God is complete only when they intend to praise in concert with all people. And they bear witness to the world of the triumph of grace over them in fervent hope that the nations – their own as well as others – will find in that triumph the work of the one whose being is the center that heals and holds. It is a psalm for any Lord's Day, but it is especially appropriate for the celebration of Worldwide Communion Sunday.

Psalm 117

"Praise the Lord, all you nations!
Extol Him, all you peoples!
For great is His steadfast love toward us,
and the faithfulness of the Lord endures forever.
Praise the Lord!"

"This is the shortest song in the whole collection, but there is none greater or grander in its expression of praise." (G. Campbell Morgan, British evangelist 1863-1945)



The November 30 service will be a normal fifth Sunday worship service and it will include the service of Wholeness & Healing. Rick Baun will conduct this portion of the worship service. We will also light the first Advent candle.

Women's Bible Study News

The Women's Bible Study has been working on the Old Testament book of Daniel since it restarted on September 10 following the summer break. This study is prepared and led by Pastor Dave Lovelace. We took a brief pause on Wednesday, October 15 to look at comparisons between Daniel 7, which we had just completed, and Revelation 4 and 5. The references we read were supplied from a chart in the appendix of our



Revelation study guide from last year. We are now reading Daniel 8 in which we learn of a vision which appeared to Daniel during the third year of the reign of King Belshazzar.

During this study, we have opened membership in the Women's Bible Study to anyone who wishes to participate. We have welcomed a few Green Hill men to the Bible study table!

The format for this study differs from our recent previous Bible Studies. We pre-read the appropriate chapter in Daniel and have a study sheet for the day's material prepared by Pastor Dave. Questions lead to discussion.

November 2025 Hymn-of-the-Month "Jesus calls us, o'er the Tumult"

This is another of the quality hymn texts written by Cecil Frances Alexander, recognized as one of Ireland's finest hymn writers. It is one of the few of Mrs. Alexander's hymn texts not specifically written for children. Nearly all of her more than 400 poems and hymn texts were intended for reaching children and teaching them the gospel.

Another of her well-beloved hymns, "There Is a Green Hill Far Away" was written for the purpose of teaching children the meaning of phrase from the Apostles' Creed, "suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried." Two other well-known hymns she wrote are "All Things Bright and Beautiful" and "Once in Royal David's City".

As a small girl, she wrote poetry for her school's journal. Following her marriage, in 1850, to the distinguished churchman, Dr. William Alexander, who later became the Anglican Archbishop for all Ireland, Mrs. Alexander devoted her literary talents to helping her husband with his ministry, including writing appropriate poems and hymns that he could use with his sermons.

She showed her concern for disadvantaged people by traveling many miles each day to visit the sick and poor, providing food, warn clothes, and medical supplies. She and her sister founded a school for the deaf. Alexander was strongly influenced by the Oxford Movement. She wrote hymns based on the Apostles' Creed, baptism, the Lord's Supper, the Ten commandments, and prayer.

Two years after their marriage, Dr. Alexander asked his wife if she could write a poem for a sermon he was planning to preach on November 30th, celebrated within the Anglican Church as St. Andrew's Day, (the patron saint of Scotland) commemorating the calling of Andrew by Jesus as recorded in Mark 1:16-18 and Matthew 4:18-20.

The tune, "Galilee", was composed for this text by William Herbert Jude, in 1887. He was a distinguished organist and the editor of several music publications. Jude was also known throughout great Britian and Australia as a music lecturer and recitalist. The tune is named for the beautiful lake in the area where Jesus met Simon Peter and Andrew.

Jesus calls us, o'er the tumult, of our life's wild restless sea.

Day by day, I hear Him saying, "Christian, come and follow me" (verse 1)

As of old, Saint Andrew heard it, by the Galilean lake.

Turned from home and toil and kindred, leaving all for His dear sake. (verse 5)

She also worked with female church leaders in the countries she visited, equipping them with the tools to be effective Women of Worth leaders themselves. Her recent mission trips have been to Nigeria, Greece, and Buenos Aires, Argentina. In Nigeria her work involved a WOW daycare and preschool, too! In November Keri will make a return trip to Romania where women from Ukraine will make the long drive from their home country to participate. In February, 2026, Keri will make a trip to Asia and minister to women in Hong Kong.

We were able to supply a **large basket of items** donated by members for Keri to give to the women attendees at her WOW ministry events. Generous Green Hill members also contributed **\$400** toward Keri's expenses, with at least one additional Green Hill contribution going directly to Keri.
